

Around the world, the evergreen tree is commonly recognized as a "Christmas tree." From small town square tree lightings to elegant window displays in the most posh cities; from kindergarten crafts to fields of cutyour-own, Christmas tree traditions are part of the way we lean towards Christmas. The Christmas tree has secular roots (yep, pun intended). Long before the advent of Christianity (so punny), people found significance in growing things that stayed green all year. In ancient times, people used evergreen in their homes, both decoratively and as a way to ward off illness and evil spirits.

Early Romans draped evergreen boughs in their homes to celebrate the Winter Solstice. Scandinavian Vikings believed in the Sun God, Balder, whose favorite plant was said to be the evergreen. The Druids used evergreen in their temples to symbolize everlasting life. For Christians, the Christmas tree as we know first made its appearance as a decorated tree inside homes thanks to 16th century Germans. Martin Luther is credited as the person who first added lights to a Christmas tree. He did this with candles, carefully wrapping tapers in wire to the boughs of the tree.

Christmas trees were originally a hard sell to American Christians when they first were seen in the United States in the 1740s. For about 100 years, American Christians still considered the Christmas tree a pagan symbol, and so it was offensive to those who wished to keep Christmas sacred. By the end of the 19th century, however, Christmas trees had grown in popularity, showing up in drawings, decorations and displays. Trees were trimmed in strings of popcorn, berries and other homemade hangings. By the time electric Christmas tree lights came along, the tree tradition was widely embraced in America. Statistics show that an average of 87% of American households put up a tree, even if it's just a small one.

The Christmas tree is a symbol we know. It's familiar in a time when the world has been through a whole lot of change and uncertainty. As people of faith, we believe in an Everlasting God-- One who does not falter, One who does not grow weary, One who does not give up on us or let go of us. Our God is no fair-weather friend, but sticks with us in the storms and in the bleakest seasons. God is constant, God is steadfast, God is true. Maybe this Christmas, we could all use a reminder that while we might be worn out, God has been faithful, and like the evergreen, provides shelter and respite. This Advent, let the lovely branches of hope, peace, love and joy unfurl around you and find God anew through this beautiful symbol from God's world.


