

We are working with a new beekeeper who is under the direction of Nicky Jones and the Earthen Bee Company. I hope to have more information about him to share with you for the next newsletter.

It is nice seeing some new faces helping in the garden this year. We are working Mondays and Thursdays from 3 P.M. to 5 P.M. With the number of people that have been showing up, the workload has been light and we are finishing up before 5 P.M.

#### Dear FCC Sisters and Brothers,

As I compile the newsletter, the Olympics have just begun in Paris for the 2024 Summer Games. Already, people are posting on social media their contentment with the Opening Ceremonies or their disgust. I haven't heard much in between. It is representative of most things people comment on. Road work, new construction, personal accomplishments, news, religion, ..... politics. Many of us have shared over the past several years how mean the wider culture has gotten. Everyone is an expert and a critic. Usually, we have limited facts though. The world is so very stuck on "being right" or holding more righteous power over another that we forget about the unity that things like the Olympics demonstrate for a world that is so terribly divided on everything. Civility is important. Respect is important. Facts are important. Our words do matter. More than anything else, the compassion and understanding that Jesus embodied and calls us to be about will lead us to the peace that is Kingdom-building. I have a little Post-It note stuck on my computer that says "ask good questions instead of always answering". One of my favorite Ted Lasso quotes is "be curious, not judgmental". In my Master's program in Mental Health Counseling, we are regularly trained in asking questions that are genuinely curious. Maybe then, the world wouldn't be such a hard-ened place. In this volatile season, may we find peace and hope in kindness and civility, but in understand-

ing and compassion as well. As Jesus taught by asking questions and telling stories, maybe we could take a "page out of His playbook" and do the same. Then we can be part of the life-giving change the world needs.
