


World Labyrinth Day Saturday, May 6th







Outreach Is Collecting Hygiene Kits For Church World Services

It's that time of year when nature wreaks havoc not only here in the USA but all around the world. Earthquakes, tornadoes, Tsunamis, Fires and Floods happen all the time. People are forced to abruptly leave their homes because of emergencies, they may not have time to pack the things they need or use on a daily basis like soap or toothbrushes. But after a few days without these items, they definitely miss them. Hygiene kits offer needed supplies and Hope. And let them know that others care for them in their time of need. Starting April 1st we will be collecting items to make hygiene kits for Church World Services. Here's how to help, make a kit on your own or you can donate any of the items needed and we will assemble the kits.

Supplies Needed: One - 1 Gallon Ziploc Bag

One - Hand Towel 15"x28" to 16"x32"

(No fingertip,bath,dish or micro-fiber towels

One - Washcloth

One - Wide tooth Comb (sturdy with 6" of teeth) (No pocket combs or picks)

One - fingernail or toenail clippers

One - Bath-size bar of soap (in package)

One - Toothbrush (in package)

Ten - Standard Band-aids




Mothering Sunday May 14, 2023


