Connect with the Pastor

As the Easter season comes to a close and we prepare to celebrate Pentecost. Typically, we characterize this celebration as the birthday of the Church. It is a simple way to look at it because when you think about what it was like at the time of Jesus' Ascension, you can almost hear the followers saying, "now what?" Then the mighty rush of wind came and suddenly the faithful few had to understand what the Holy Spirit was and how it impacted their faith going forward. When I was defending my faith statement for my ordination some 23 years ago, my committee asked me why I didn't talk about the Holy Spirit much. I recall that I said something lame like, "it's the aspect of the Trinity that is most difficult to understand and explain." While I still don't disagree with that statement, I now can add a lot more to this point. It must have been wild to understand God/Jesus in this new way with the person of Jesus being gone (at least from a physical sense). Come to think of it, it can be a wild concept to think of now. Therein lies the gift of faith and the power of the community of faith acting upon that faith together (even with all of our differences). I think this is why Pentecost is as important to me as our Easter celebrations. God is constantly calling us to be courageous and stretch our imaginations beyond what we thought capable. God puts Jesus literally in our hands to carry the faith in the present and the future. Celebrate the fires of the Spirit with me this Sunday!
