Happy New Year dear church family!!! Hope the new year brings you joy, love, peace and hope. As we begin a new year with new hopes and dreams, we need to look back at 2025 and all that has happened at our "Little Church With The Big Heart". In January of 2024, we were concerned about the future of our church and where we were headed. We saw that our income was down while the cost of everything was going up. We weren't growing in size but shrinking due to the loss of several of our dearest people. We wondered how long we could keep the doors open. We had big plans for things we wanted to do. It was scary to think of the future. The pandemic was so hard on everyone, but here we are still being the light and love of Jesus Christ to the world around us. And thanks to the generosity of two ladies, the Sass Sisters, who most of us never knew, we had options and a continued future. A little background about the Sass Sisters. They were members of the Hammond church and when they passed away they left the church their final tithe. That money was placed in a fund in Indianapolis that has grown over the years. We have been able to use some of that money to help keep us running. We will keep the doors open and put our faith and trust in God to see us through the tough times. The future is looking up for us as we have been blessed with new families and friends coming to our little church. Now to 2025 review: We had a few unexpected big expenses (Roof repair and AC/Furnace replacement) and we had lots of good things happen. We collected 226 cans of soup for the "Souper Bowl of Caring" which helped our Blessing Box Pantry. Kevin & Tania Messmer through Super Bowl Squares helped raise \$2275 for the pantry. Stitch In Time ministry blessed 21 blankets and 15 kids kits for cancer patients. We served 6 lunches at Hammond Homeless Shelter. Our garden provided fresh vegetables to Greater Hammond Community Service. Through the Foodbank we provided 51 seniors monthly food boxes. Your generosity help provide 12 children and 12 families with gifts and food at Christmas through the Angel Tree program. And finally we had awesome worship opportunities all year. Easter through Christmas we were blessed with wonderful messages of hope, love, joy and peace. We were blessed with beautiful music and the children's play. We will always be the "Little church with the big heart" and we must never lose our faith in God and each other. The year 2025 was a great year!! Great work all you faithful servants.

Dear FCC Sisters and Brothers,

February and March invite us into a season that feels both tender and necessary. Lent arrives each year not as an escape from the world, but as a companion to it. We come carrying headlines that feel heavy, questions without easy answers, and a sense that so much around us is uncertain. Many of us are tired. Some of us are grieving. Others are quietly wondering what faith looks like in times like these. And still, Lent asks us to imagine. This year, our Lenten series is called **"The Work of Imagination."** Not imagination as fantasy or denial, but imagination as holy courage. The kind of imagination that allows us to see beyond what is broken toward what is possible. The kind that helped the prophets speak hope into exile, that allowed Jesus to envision a kingdom shaped by mercy rather than fear, and that continues to whisper to us that the story is not finished yet. Imagination is work because it requires intention. It asks us to slow down, to notice, to question what we have assumed must always be this way. It invites us to wonder what God might be creating even now, beneath the surface of a weary world. This Lent, we will practice that work together. Through worship, prayer, and reflection, we will explore how imagination shapes faith, justice, compassion, and resilience. We will ask what it means to imagine repair where there is fracture, belonging where there is isolation, and hope where despair has tried to settle in. And woven into this season is a profound sign of that hope.

This year, we will celebrate **five baptisms** in our community. Five moments when we pause to remember that God is still calling, still claiming, still beginning new things among us. Baptism does not erase uncertainty or guarantee an easy road ahead. What it does proclaim is deeper and truer: that love has the first word, and the last. That no matter how complex the world becomes, grace continues to flow. In a time when so much feels fragile, these baptisms remind us that faith is not only about endurance. It is about becoming. Becoming more open, more grounded, more willing to trust that God is at work even when we cannot yet see the full picture. My hope for this Lenten season is not that we will have all the answers, but that we will dare to imagine together. That we will make room for lament and for joy, for honesty and for wonder. That we will remember we are not alone, and that the Spirit continues to stir new life among us. May this season be gentle with you.

May it stretch your imagination.

And may it remind us all that even in uncertain times, God is still doing a new thing.
