Remarks from Rebecca

Dear FCC Brothers and Sisters,

Recently a colleague asked a group of his peers what the most powerful experience of communion we have had. He was asking this question for a Doctor of Ministry project he was working on. For a few brief moments I thought about my answer and I started to convey my answer in more detail than I thought I could recall. During my first pastorate serving in Springfield, IL, I took a group of people on a mission trip to the Pine Ridge Reservation in Pine Ridge, South Dakota. About midway through the week, we were on our way to our work site, when we stopped at the memorial for the Battle of Wounded Knee. We learned in detail about the massacre of the Lakota people that occurred where we stood. As Rev. Keith, our leader, taught us more than we learned in our history books and made the true story come to life for each of us, we began to feel a myriad of emotions. It was troubling to say the least. There was a very real sense we were standing on sacred and holy ground. There was shame and anger at atrocity of the massacre of over 300 Lakota people. And yet there was some hopefulness because the work we were readying ourselves to do that do could maybe bring hope to the people we sought to serve. As we were navigating the complexities of our emotions, Rev. Keith suggested we share in communion together. He started rummaging through his truck for what would serve as the Body and the Blood of Jesus. He returned to the tailgate and hopped up on the back and said, "welp, all I have is graham crackers and apple juice. I think its ok because God will understand our purpose here. Graham crackers can be the Body and apple juice will be the Blood. " Transformation can and does happen in the most unlikely places and/or with the most unlikely resources. I have never looked at graham crackers the same ever again. That day changed my understanding of the power of God to change simple things into holy things. God managed to take our shame, grief and horror at what we witnessed into a profound understanding that God invites all to the table and how we can be agents of justice and healing. There was so very much that happened in that bit of cracker and juice in that sacred place. I carry that moment with me each time I receive the bread and the cup. What about you? What experience of communion has been transformational for you?




The Gratitude Hike will be November 23rd at 11 A.M. We will walk the Coffee Creek Preserve in
