





## 7 CHRISTIAN MINDFULNESS EXERCISES

"This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Psalm 118:24

#### 1. Ground yourself in the present moment.

Accept this moment as a gift from God. Identify 5 things you can see, 4 things you can feel, 3 things you can hear, 2 things you can smell, and 1 thing you can taste.

## 2. Breathe deeply with a two-word anchor prayer.

Focus on your breath. Repeat a two-word prayer in your mind. Breathe one word in and one word out. For example, "Trust, lean"; "My rock, my fortress."

### 3. Take a Bible meditation break.

Read a short Bible verse or passage. Notice what stands out to you. Reflect on what the Lord is saying to you. Thank Him for it and end with a prayer.

## 4. Listen mindfully to people you talk with.

Be present with people. Pay attention to what they say so you don't get distracted by your own thoughts. Value them as people created in the image of God.

#### 5. Pause to appreciate natural beauty.

Look out the window or go outside. What do your senses show you? What colors and shapes do you see in the sky? Do you see tree branches moving in the wind? Can you see or hear any animals or birds? Notice these details and thank God for the beauty of His creation. "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." Psalm 19:1

## 6. Notice how your body feels with a body scan.

Sit down comfortably and close your eyes. First bring your attention to your feet, then to your legs, torso, back, arms, neck, face, and head. Notice the sensations you feel in each part of your body. Thank God for how He designed each part.

## 7. Say a prayer of blessing for others.

Extend love and compassion to others by saying a prayer of blessing for them. Bring someone to mind and be aware of God's presence with them. Say a biblical prayer of blessing for them or pray in your own words. "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace."


