

Sojourner's also helps the homeless and needy in the area through their food pantry, clothing pantry, and community garden. How can you help? Deordorant (men and women)
Soap - bath size
Fingernail or toenail clippers
Razors (men and women)
Bandaids (10 bandaid per kit)
Gallon Ziploc Bags
